### **Heritage Register – Neighbourhood**

- 1) Historical Name:** Redstone
- 2) Common Name(s):** Golf Course
- 3) Location:** Bounded in the north by Highway 3B and diagonally to Princess Street, in the west by Queen Street and south and east by the City of Rossland boundary.
- 4) Date of Construction:** Golf clubhouse was built in 1927 but single detached houses were not built until the early 2000's.

### **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

#### **Description:**

The Redstone neighbourhood is located in the southeast quadrant of the City of Rossland. It is bounded in the north by Highway 3B and diagonally to Princess Street. The west boundary is Queen Street and the south and east border is the City of Rossland boundary. The golf course was built in 1927. It is a beautiful neighbourhood of single detached houses built starting in the 2000s.

#### **Heritage Value:**

The Redstone neighbourhood is valued primarily as a quiet and contemporary suburb of Rossland, with large new houses on sizable properties. Older properties not located in the new

subdivision are valued by their residents for their quiet isolation. Redstone residents, in general, find the neighbourhood valuable for its proximity to forest trails and the golf course.

**Character Defining Elements:**

- Recent houses in contemporary styles on large properties.
- Golf Course.
- Forest hillside and valley settings.
- Trailheads to forest walks, often following historic rail or road alignments.
